Suspected misconduct with minors by a priest, deacon, or religious should be reported directly to the Bishop or Vicar General (P. O. Box 2279, Brownsville, TX 78522-2279; 956-542-2501). A form for a *Confidential Notice of Concern*, may be used, and obtained on request from the local pastor, school principal, institution head, or Diocese, or it may be downloaded from the Brownsville Diocese website (www.cdob.org).

Please be aware that it is a state law that anyone who suspects abuse or neglect of a minor must report it to local law enforcement officials or to the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at 1-800-252-5400.

Una sospecha de mala conducta con los menores de edad, cometida por el personal laico de la iglesia, deberá reportarse al párroco de la iglesia, al director de la escuela, o al encargado de la institución católica en cuestión. Una sospecha de mala conducta con los menores de edad cometida por un sacerdote, diácono, o religioso deberá reportarse directamente al Señor Obispo o al Vicario General al (P.O. Box 2279, Brownsville, TX 78522-2279; 956-542-2501). Una forma para un *Aviso Confidencial de Inquietud (Confidential Notice of Concern)* puede obtenerse a través del párroco local, del director de la escuela, del encargado de la institución, de la Diócesis, o puede bajarse de la página oficial de Internet de la Diócesis de Brownsville (www.cdob.org).

Por favor recuerde que hay una ley estatal que cualquier persona que sospeche el abuso o la negligencia hacia un menor de edad debe reportarlo a las autoridades oficiales locales o al Departamento de Servicios Familiares y Protectores de Texas (Texas Department of Family and Protective Services) al 1-800-252-5400.


SACRAMENTS

TODAY'S WORD OF GOD

September 15, 2024

Yesterday we celebrated the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. That's quite a mouthful, but it means that by dying on the cross, which he willingly accepted, Jesus was exalted. In today's Gospel, Jesus confides in his disciples for the first time that he would be persecuted and killed. Then turning to the entire crowd, he tells them that they must take up their crosses, for it is in sacrificing their lives they can save them. Are you willing to accept your cross, difficult as it may be? As you ponder that question, remember this: your cross, the cross Jesus calls you to shoulder, is linked to the Holy Cross itself, which is the most beautiful sign of our salvation.

Isaiah, attacked and rejected for speaking out, assuredly had a difficult cross to bear. But today we hear him insisting that he is willing to face all his opponents, for he trusts in GOD. James writes that faith must be put into action, which may lead to carrying a difficult cross. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the crowd that each person must take up his or her cross if they wish to save their life. As we listen to the readings, let us ponder which crosses we are reluctant to carry and pray for the strength and resolve to shoulder them.

PALABRA DE DIOS DE HOY

15 de septiembre de 2024

Ayer celebramos la fiesta de la Exaltación de la Santa Cruz. Significa que Jesús fue exaltado al morir en la cruz por propia voluntad. En el Evangelio de hoy Jesús le confía a sus discípulos por primera vez que será perseguido y que lo matarán. Y después se dirige a toda la multitud y le dice que deben cargar con sus propias cruces, porque es al entregar su vida que la salvarán. ¿Estás dispuesto a aceptar tu cruz, por muy difícil que sea? Al considerar esta pregunta recuerda esto: tu cruz, la cruz que Jesús te pide llevar sobre tus hombros, está vinculada a la Santa Cruz, la cual es el signo más hermoso de nuestra salvación.

Isaías, atacado y rechazado por expresarse, tuvo ciertamente una cruz difícil de cargar. Pero hoy lo oímos insistir en que está dispuesto a enfrentar a sus adversarios, pues confía en Dios. Santiago escribe que la fe ha de traducirse en obras, lo cual pudiera implicar una cruz difícil de cargar. En el Evangelio Jesús le dice a la multitud que cada persona ha de cargar con su propia cruz, si quieren salvar su vida. Al escuchar estas lecturas, consideremos cuáles son las cruces que estamos renuentes a cargar y oremos para recibir la fuerza y la resolución de echárnoslas al hombro.
